The US Possessions Special Delivery Stamps

The US Possessions after the Spanish American War were issued special delivery stamps. Cuba, Guam and the Philippines each were issued the 1895 US issue overprinted with the names of their countries, in very short supply. Postally used stamps are rare, and if not for John Zug and General Bandholtz, we would not have many examples to enjoy in our hobby. Plate 492 was used for CUBA and 882 was used for the Cuba Specimen overprint which is extremely rare. Plate 882 has the dots in the arch variety. Plates 880-881-882 and 883 were re-used for Guam and the Philippines; again the dots variety exists on plate 882. None of these stamps are common and multiples in any form are difficult to rare.
